Anti-social Behaviour in Long Itchington

Following on from our recent email and Facebook post regarding increasing levels of anti-social behaviour in the village, the police have been very helpful and have reviewed our CCTV footage and will be talking to Southam College and the parents of children involved then reviewing what action to take.

Multiple incidents have been logged as 'anti-social behaviour incidents', including vandalising the public toilets (twice), graffiti on play equipment and serious damage to a narrow boat. The police have urged all residents to report any incidents of criminal or anti-social behaviour, however minor it may seem. This will help the police to spot any patterns of behaviour and help us tackle the issues. You can report non urgent crimes on 101 or you can complete a short on line report form that can be found at https://www.warwickshire.police.uk/ro/report/ocr/af/how-to-report-a-crime/

We are also very concerned to hear that some young children are fearful of going out to play in case they are confronted by certain older young people who are intimidating them. We encourage parents to talk with younger children to see if this is the case for them. Please talk to us if you have any worries.

Neighbourhood Plan

Our Neighbourhood Plan has reached an important stage; it has now been through an extensive external examination. The Examiner has made certain recommendations and concluded that it now proceeds to Referendum. He said: "Long Itchington Parish Council is to be congratulated on its extensive efforts to produce a Neighbourhood Plan for their area that will guide development activity over the period until 2031."

We hope that this referendum will take place in the Autumn and that, by the end of 2022, Long Itchington and Bascote Neighbourhood Area will have a Plan representing the views of residents and a document which can be relied upon when considering planning applications. We encourage everyone to take part in the referendum.

Parish Accounts

The parish accounts are currently going through the annual audit process and electors who are resident in the parish are welcome to make an appointment to view the invoices and financial records if they so wish.

Ruby's Meadow – the latest

The long-standing planning application to develop 9 self-build dwellings on a much loved and beautiful meadow has faced a significant challenge. But Planning Committee members earlier this month voted 5: 2 against the development.

Whilst, this was not the decision we were expecting, we were delighted that District Councillors were swayed by powerful arguments that this unique part of our parish must be preserved in its natural state. But, this is not the end, it is highly likely that Rosconn Strategic Land (the developer) will appeal this decision.

We wish to warmly thank Cllr Chris Kettle for speaking so effectively on our behalf, making some vital points. We also pay tribute to Cllr Jon Venn who spoke very convincingly on the night and who has worked tirelessly for the community on this important issue.

Wildlife News + Update on the car in the pond

It's a great time to explore the many natural resources in our parish. In the **LILAC** field the change to the grass cutting has provided small mammals with new places to live and find food. The long grass now provides extra visual and nature interest, while helping to reduce carbon emissions and maintenance. One highlight is the arrival of Common Spotted Orchids in the field which is very positive.

The **community nature reserve at Bascote Road** has new bird boxes and the start of a new pond.

The **village pond**: vegetation damaged from the road accident is recovering well. There was no oil pollution from the car. Ducks and the swan seem none the worse for their scare.

At **Whites Spinney**, there is an ongoing programme of thinning out of the epicormic growth from the lime trees, to help create a more diverse woodland habitat.

A reminder that it is the home-owner's responsibility to prune hedges & foliage which over-hang public footpaths, pavements or lights.

If foliage is obstructing your property but doesn't belong to you, please phone us on 01926 815216 for advice as there are specific times of year when radical pruning is not advisable.

Fishing is not permitted at the Pond

CPR/defibrillator training

West Midlands Ambulance Service is offering to run a CPR and defibrillator training session here in Long Itchington. This is part of a current project to raise awareness of Public Access Defibrillators (PADs) and how to do CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). With three PADs in our community these potentially life-saving skills are ones we should all think about learning.

The session would last for c.1.5 hours with a demonstration and time for a practice. No date has yet been fixed but we're thinking a Saturday morning in the autumn in the community centre.

New 123 Waste Collections from August 5th

The way your waste is collected is changing

You should all have received food bins and caddies and a leaflet explaining the new service. If you haven't, please contact **01789 260616** or go to

In brief, the new service is as follows:

- 1. A **food waste** collection, **every week** using a food caddy
- 2. A **recycling** collection, **every two weeks** using your **blue** bin.
- 3. Your **black** refuse bin collection for all **non-recyclable** waste will be **every 3 weeks**.
- 4. Garden waste (green bin) collection every two weeks.
